Because he are practicing 'social distancing' and all public **Anzac Day** gathering and ceremonies have been cancelled, doesn't mean we can't mark Anzac Day in a meaningful and community spirited way together.

Let us all gather at our own letterboxes (or on your unit's balcony) on Saturday 25 April at 5:55am to prepare for a minute silence together.

If anyone has a musical instrument and would like to play something suitable just prior to the 6am Minute of Silence - then that would be wonderful!

You might also come up with another way to show your respect. e.g. - chalk drawings on your driveway, make more paper poppies (see below), display an Australian Flag, make a sign with the words "Lest We Forget" etc. Let's all get creative - we certainly have the time!

Here is a paper poppy for you to cut out, make and then place on your letterbox/balcony prior to Anzac Day to show your that you will be participating in this collective, but 'socially distant' ANZAC Day Commemoration. (There might also a small amount of "tac" for you to stick your Poppy to your letterbox). You can also print, make and attach these to small stick/skewers and place in your garden or the Council/nature strip.
